Guard dogs – Enhancing premises security

We have all heard the expression, "man's best friend" with reference to dogs. Well the same is true when it comes to security as dogs as these four-legged creatures can truly enhance security at premises.

Guard-dogs provide additional reinforcement to security guards who are carrying out their day to day duties. They can boost security where the premises are quite big and cannot be adequately covered by the guards on duty. In addition, the perimeter wall at the premises might not adequately deter would be intruders and might allow easy access by scaling over the top. The premises might also hold high value goods inside which make it necessary to have early detection when the dogs senses that there is an intruder on site and barks to warn the guard on duty. The guard dog will also act as a deterrent to would be thieves as the intruder will fear being attacked. Guard-dogs are taken through a regime of instruction so that they are prepared for all potentially volatile situations. Aggression and obedience training form part of the curriculum. The training which is carried out at Sectra, the Guard-Alert Group training division, takes a total of 21 days.

For optimum security, the guard at the premises should be a trained dog handler. Training for dog handling is also for 21 days. The training undertaken will cover all aspects of how to handle the dog professionally and keep the dog under control. In addition to feeding the dog, the dog handler also carries out regular assessments on the general well being of the dog.

Well trained dogs are not deterred by aggressive behavior from a thief such as the use of loud noises and wild gestures. The dog will react to the aggressor through incessant barking or attacking the intruder thus ensuring premises are well protected. The early detection through the enhanced sense of smell of dogs ensures that thieves are detected early, and no break in will take place as the barking will alert the guard on duty of the approach of thieves. If the dog is at a house, the barking will also warn the house-owners that something is amiss at their premises and they will either be able to investigate or press the panic button to call for assistance from the Rapid Response team.

Want to go in-house? Consider this...

There is a point in time when companies might consider moving to in-house security especially when most are considering where to make their next cost-cutting move. Though this might be seen to be a prudent move, professional security companies know that there are costs to having internal security and would like a number of issues considered before disengaging contract guards.

A professional distance should be maintained between security personnel and the staff at the premises being guarded. When internal guards are used, this can be compromised as the guards might get too friendly with the staff as they feel they are part of the workforce. This will definitely compromise security at the premises as some of the guards might not be very vigilant when carrying out their duties due to over familiarity.

If a company hires contract guards, they have the option to rotate guards should they feel that they are not performing optimally or even that the guards are now becoming over familiar. There is greater room for flexibility and room for movement than if the company is using internal guards. There is also a pool of guards to choose from if the guard should fall sick, or be absent from work for any reason. With the contract guards, it will simply be a matter of re-arranging schedules and re-assigning guards to ensure coverage of the contract.

The administration of internal guards can be time consuming and will not allow the company to focus on its core business. Consequently, this might not be done well as resources do not permit, leading to compromised security at the premises. Additionally, there is need for experienced personnel to administer the guards, ensure an effective rotation system and supervision of the guards, all greatly involving tasks.

Vetting of guards is also important when recruiting guards to check for previous employment records and any criminal history. This is done professionally and efficiently by established security companies who will carry out the task at no extra cost to the company.

The next time your company starts to consider recruiting internal guards, you will be able to make an informed choice. It pays to do the right thing the first time.



Electric fencing solutions

Electric fences were initially developed to keep out animals. However, the fencing is now being installed at residential and commercial premises to help enhance security at the perimeter of the premises. Below is some information which will be useful in your choice of this electronic security solution.

Q. Name two fence applications A. There are wall top fencing applications, ie on top of a security wall and there are also free standing fences

Q. How does and electric fence work A. The electric fence energizer converts the mains or battery power into a high voltage pulse which releases a pulse onto the insulated

fence line every few seconds. A person or animal touching the fence will complete an electric circuit and conduct the pulse causing a slight electric shock.

Q. Is the electric shock deadly

A. Not at all. When an animal or human being gets an electric shock, the pain does not cause physical harm- it just causes a level of discomfort which acts as a deterrent to would be intruders

Q. Why would I choose to install an electric fence around my premises

A.There are several reasons why one would install an electric fence around their premises and these include:

Cost- electric fences require less material than conventional fences

Keeps intruders off the premises if it is properly maintained

There is visual protection as would be intruders who see the fence together with the warning sign would not want to entre such premises

Q. Can the electric fence be connected to an alarm

A. Yes it can. The electric fence can be connected to an exisiting alarm system which can in turn be connected to the Rapid Response service. The alarm will go off if the fence is interfered with in any way, alerting the premises owner.
